The importance of good attendance and punctuality

On Monday 8th January, the government launched its new campaign, 'Moments Matter, Attendance Counts' to improve attendance and punctuality in schools. At St George's CE Primary School we believe that attendance and punctuality at school is not only a legal requirement, but is fundamental to a child's development and attainment. Local Authorities, Schools, Parents and the wider community all have a role to play in improving attendance.



There is strong link between good attendance, punctuality and achieving good results. Having frequent absences from school may affect academic progress as well as have a negative effect on maintaining friendships. **Good attendance** is seen to be **96% and above** and at SGPS we strongly encourage this. Each week in assembly, we celebrate the class with the highest attendance and they receive the Attendance Bear to look after for the week. Every day, in every class, a letter is awarded if all the children are in. When a class has achieved all the letters in ATTENDANCE, they are rewarded with a non-uniform day.

In order to support us with better attendance, and in turn benefit your child, we ask families to avoid taking day trips, long weekends and family holidays in term time. We also ask that any dentist or doctor's appointments are made outside of the school day, where possible. If your child is genuinely unwell, then of course they must stay at home to get better, you are the parent and you know your child best as to when they are poorly. But if you are unsure, then send them into school and let the teacher know they are a little under the weather, as on lots of occasions, children rally once they are in the school environment and with friends. We would always contact you to collect your child if they were genuinely too unwell to be in school.

Our Attendance Officer, Miss Preston, will continue to work with families to ensure that children are in school every day and in class by 9:00am.
