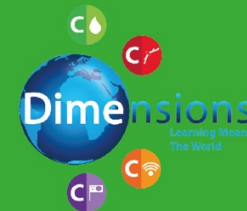

bungalow	a house with only one floor; no stairs up or down		
habitat	the natural home of an animal or plant		
nest	a place made by an animal to lay eggs or rear their young		
den	a resting place for large animals or a cosy place made from items found at home		
lighthouse	a tower with a flashing light near the sea, to warn ships of cliffs and rocks		
camping	sleeping in tents or rough shelters outdoors for a short time
